



Grant funds help farmers improve stream quality

Small farmers now can take advantage of federal grant money to reduce *E. coli* bacteria in creeks that flow into the Lower Cass River. Landowner commitment is only a 25% match, including in-kind goods and services. Up to \$10,000 per project is available. Funds can be used to create:

- Livestock crossings
- Exclusionary fencing
- Watering systems/diversions
- Manure stacking facilities

Improvements can increase your property value, make the land healthier for you and your livestock, and ensure your family can enjoy a clean local stream.
